

Notice for Iranian citizens applying for “F” and “M” Visa for China (Mainland Only)

1. In general an official Invitation Letter (TE) or Verification Letter of Invitation is required ,which should be provided by the inviter in China.

2. Invitation Letter (TE) or Verification Letter of Invitation can be exempt, if all the following five documents are provided:

(1) Invitation letter issued by the inviter in China, which should be in Chinese in principle, filled in computer, printed and contain all the elements below:(In general Invitation letter should be issued according to the formats provided by this embassy and written in Chinese.)

- Information of the visa applicant (full name, gender, date of birth, passport number).
- Information of the visit (purpose of visit, arrival and departure dates, places of visit, itinerary, relationship between the visa applicant and the inviter, financial supports).
- Information of the inviter (names of the individual or company or organizaion, mobile phone number, fixed-line phone number, address, official seal, signature of inviter or legal representative).
- It should be declared in the invitation letter that the visa applicant will abide by the laws and regulations of china during the stay and leave China on time.

(2) Copy of one of the documents below from the inviter:

- Business License.
- Certification of Organization Code.
- Certification of Tax Registration.
- Other registry licenses in China.

3. Original certificate of bank deposit (no less than 5000 USD), or assets certificate (no less than 10000 USD) or original bank credit certificate. For the first two documents, extra 100 USD per day is required according to the itinerary of the visa applicant in China.

(3) Travel insurance.

(4) Confirmed round flight ticket

Attentions:

1. The consular officials may request applicants to come for interview during visa application, or for checking entry and exit records after coming back from China. Visa applicants should be cooperative for the above requirements.
2. According to “Exit and Entry Administration Law of the People’s Republic of China”, the individual or company or organization issuing invitation letters should be responsible for the authenticity of all the information in the invitation letters.
